The Kidron Valley/Wadi Nar Master Plan The Kidron Valley begins in the Jerusalem neighborhoods of Meah Shaarim and Talbieh, passes through Silwan and continues through the West Bank to the Dead Sea. Some of the Middle East's most famous cultural, religious and historic sites are found in the valley. Without a peace treaty between the Palestinians and Israelis, however, unchecked development and neglect has had major health, environmental, and economic consequences. Today one of the great centers of civilization serves as a conduit for raw sewage and a depository of solid waste. The Kidron Valley/Wadi Nar Master Plan brings together a multinational, multi-cultural planning team, comprised of architects, hydrologists, engineers, archaeologists, ecologists, economists, sociologists, and other specialists to recommend and implement collaborative solutions to this environmental crisis.
